- Ask for explanations of anything you don't understand Ask your child's teacher for ways that you can help your child at home.

HOMEWORK TIPS

Set up a homework-friendly area. Make sure kids have a well-lit place to complete homework. Keep supplies — paper, pencils, glue, scissors — within reach.

- 1. Schedule a regular study time. Some kids work best in the afternoon, following a snack and play period; others may prefer to wait until after dinner.
- 2. Help them make a plan. On heavy homework nights or when there's an especially hefty assignment to tackle, encourage your child to break up the work into manageable chunks. Create a work schedule for the night if necessary and take time for a 15-minute break every hour, if possible.
- 3. Keep distractions to a minimum. This means no TV, loud music, or phone calls.
- **4. Be a motivator and monitor.** Ask about assignments, quizzes, and tests. Give encouragement, check completed homework, and make yourself available for questions and concerns.
- **5. Praise their work and efforts.** Post an aced test or art project on the refrigerator. Mention academic achievements to relatives.

Cold & flu season is upon us!

- What is the flu? -Influenza (also known as the flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and lungs (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention).
- Flu is different from the common cold.
- When possible, stay away from people who are sick and avoid others when you or your children are sick to keep from infecting others.
- Remember to cover coughs and sneezes and wash hands often.
- If your child becomes sick, please do not send them to school and make sure they get plenty of rest and drink enough fluids.
- Children may return to school after being fever free for 24 hours (without the use of fever reducing medication). A fever is defined as a temperature of 100 F or higher.
