Nurse Notes

Hi everyone! In October we will begin our Hearing, Vision and Dental screenings!

- Hearing screening - must be provided annually for all preschool, kindergarten, first, second, and third grade students. If your child had an ear examination by a physician and an evaluation completed by an audiologist within the previous 12 months, a completed and signed report form is also acceptable.
- Vision screening - must be provided annually for all preschool, kindergarten, second, and eighth grade students. If your child had an eye exam within the previous 12 months by a licensed optometrist or a doctor specializing in diseases of the eye, this completed form is also acceptable. Both of these screenings (hearing & vision) are also provided annually for any child in special education classes, for any student who was referred by a teacher and for any students new to the district.
- Dental services - the Sarah Bush Lincoln dental services will be making their first appearance at the end of October. If you would like more information about these services, please reach out to the SBL dental clinic.

CHECKING YOUR STUDENT'S GRADES

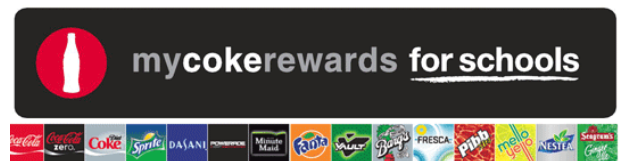
